Here is an item of interest to your readers. A colleague and I have created an interactive simulation of an industrial process (cutting and heat treating chipper blade stock). The materials are a case study for use by statistics students and for workplace training in statistics and SPC. Data generated using the simulation may be analyzed using Excel or other software. The contents are a factory walk-through in VRML, background information on heat-treating, the main process simulation application, a user guide, a review of statistics for SPC, and information on the project. The simulation is intended for general use and does not require familiarity with heat treating.
